ALERT WASHINGTON

Alert Washington is a mass notification system that allows staff at the Washington County Emergency Management Operations Center to provide residents with timely alerts. Residents sign up by entering their contact information and subscribing to notifications of interest at https://member.everbridge.net/index/453003085614808#/login. The information provided is protected and will not be used for any other purpose.

HAVE A FAMILY EMERGENCY PLAN

Make a plan today. Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes, so it is important to know which types of disasters could affect your area. Know how you'll contact one another and reconnect if separated. Establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find. Visit https://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan for more information.

What to Pack in an Emergency Go Kit Water, one gallon of water person per day for at least three days

- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with extra batteries
- Flashlight with extra batteries First Aid Kit Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to filter contaminated air Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or plier to turn off utilities Can opener for food Local Map

Also, include: Especially if evacuating to a Shelter

- Prescription Medications Infant formula and diapers
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Important Family Documents (Insurance policies, bank account info, identification)
- Sleeping Bag, warm blankets, extra clothes and sturdy shoes Hygiene Items
